TJORITJORINJA

ILTJA NTJARAA MANY HANDS ART CENTRE

We are excited to be exhibiting at Ngununggula, Southern Highlands Regional Gallery where we'll have the privilege of showcasing our new works on beautiful Gundungurra Country. An expression and reflection of country, the works depict Tjoritja (pronounced Choor-it-ja) – West MacDonnell Ranges country that stretches for 161 kilometres west of Mparntwe (Alice Springs).

This project involved both senior and emerging artists based in Mparntwe and Ntaria Community (Hermannsburg) 120km west of Mparntwe.

20 current Iltja Ntjarra (Many Hands) artists worked hard to present a unique and innovative body of work including, works on paper, watercolour on repurposed road signs, silk, and wooden artefacts. Established and mid-career artists Vanessa Inkamala, Hubert Pareroultja, Mervyn Rubuntja, Selma Coulthard, Ivy Pareroultja, Betty Namatjira Wheeler, Marcus Wheeler, Stanley Ebatarinja, Kathy Inkamala, Reinhold Inkamala and Benita Clements worked alongside, and supported, new and emerging artists Mandy Malbunka, Dellina Inkamala, Dianne Inkamala, Delray Inkamala, Bronwyn Lankin, Tina Malbunka, Kathleen France, Ada Lechleitner and Russell Inkamala.

All artists working here at the Iltja Ntjarra Art Centre are continuing to paint in the Hermannsburg School tradition established by their grandfather and relative, Albert Namatjira. Everyone here is family. Artists are connected through their Dreamings, their ancestors' bloodline and by learning to paint in the Hermannsburg School style passed down through the generations, taught by the senior elders painting in the early years of the watercolour movement. By carrying on his legacy our artists are sustaining an important piece of living history. The works made for this exhibition are an expression of these multilayered connections.





The exhibition title refers to how artists connect and belong to country and ultimately each other. This notion is expressed through traditional naming systems. Our people have traditional names and a kinship system, many of our people had tribal names, which connected them to their country. The significant sites that are inspiration for our artists' work are the conceptional sites of their family name and where they belong. In a similar way that non-Indigenous peoples' surnames might refer to the profession of their forefathers, for example Smith referring to blacksmiths, our surnames refer to our forefather's connection to country and place.

A series of powerful repurposed road signs speak to the way country is named and boundaries have been drawn since colonisation. Brother and sister Reinhold and Vanessa Inkamala have painted on large square signs, reclaiming these road markers back to country. Vanessa also worked with her sisters, Delray, and Dianne Inkamala to depict the way the environment has been changed by tourism and the arrival of missionaries. Other significant road sign works have been created by Kathleen France, Mandy Malbunka, Selma Coulthard, Ada Lechleitner, Kathy Inkamala, Dellina Inkamala and Mervyn Rubuntja.

In contrast a series of suspended silk panels work with light and transparency to tell stories from the artists' childhood. Treasured and happy memories of childhoods spent on country are depicted alongside darker stories about time spent off country negatively influenced by alcohol. Selma Coulthard's silk panels recalls her childhood at Tempe Downs, incorporating text, the work depicts six vivid scenes.

One of the bodies of work presented in the exhibition are a series of painted wooden artefacts. Carved in Mulga and Beanwood by Wayne Armstrong, Granville Inkamala, Fabian Raggett, Dean Inkamala and Brandon Presley, these objects reference Namatjira's early history of artefact making. In the same way that in the 1930s Namatjira engaged other men to cut and shape artefacts on which he then painted, the Iltja Ntjarra (Many Hands) artists have worked with men from Ntaria (Hermannsburg) to carve on wooden artefacts on which they then painted their stories. Boomerangs, shields, spears, and clap sticks are featured, supporting men to collect and make work on their own country.

Also included in the exhibition are 20 watercolour paintings on paper mostly by established artists. For our artists watercolour on paper is the foundational practice from which new and experimental works develops and extends from. On show alongside the works of living Iltja Ntajrra artists are three paintings by Namatjira on loan from the National Gallery of Australia. Painted by Namatjira between 1948 and 1955, they depict three significant sites in Tjoritja (West MacDonnell Ranges). Contemporary artists have responded to these historical works, asserting their own connections.

Tjoritjarinja – Belonging to the West MacDonnell Ranges represents Iltja Ntjarra artists' ongoing and unfolding connections to each other through Dreaming, bloodline, kinship, and the heritage of the Hermannsburg School.


